Mind the gap! What about municipal actors in river governance?

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Global river pollution

70-90% rely on surface waters for drinking and food production

90% wastewater are dumped untreated



2 out 9 million metric tons / year of plastics flow through rivers into oceans

1 in 10 rivers is severely to moderately polluted













IWRM in Citarum

>30-year of cross-scale coordination programs driven by provincial and national governments.

In 2018 the governments established:

- Citarum Harum Action Plan
- Presidential regulation no. 15 Year 2018
- Water quality target by 2025.
- Citarum Taskforce as a coordinating agency













Governance failure?

- The history of IWRM in Citarum shows symptoms of reactive decision-making in the infrastructure sector faced by crisis (Novalia & Malekpour, 2020).
- Systemic failures of decision making across planning, development, and environmental sectors over the past two decades has led to Citarum heavy degradation (Kusuma et al., 2018).











IWRM in theory

- IWRM has gained popularity but little evidence of success in practice. (Biswas, 2008)
- Local implementation of IWRM principles is elusive.

TOP DOWN

National and provincial governments coordinating policies through Basin Taskforce

MIDDLE IN-OUT

Municipalities driving implementation and policy feedback to the top

BOTTOM UP

Community participation in implementation and decision making











Municipal actors and river governance

- Limited research on local enablers for river governance. (Jetoo, 2017)
- Research questions:
 - What are the enablers for implementation of river revitalization policies at the local level?
 - How can we enhance the capacity of municipal actors to implement river revitalization policies at the local level?











Synthesis of local enablers



Perception of problems



High level political & financial commitment



Intermediaries & bridging organisations



Local leaderships and frontline bureaucrats

Formal coordinating structure and agencies

Community participation and social movements











Building capacity

- Two locations in Citarum Basin
- Methods: case studies and participatory workshops

- Action research to test local enablers and co-develop governance frameworks.
- Local experiments with naturebased and circular economy solutions.
